## **Uniform Reminder**

We have had a number of students arriving to school in incorrect uniform recently. Please can you support us by checking your child has the correct uniform before leaving the house. See below for a reminder of our uniform rules.

**Uniform** - students should be wearing the correct uniform, green or black blazer, kilt/trousers, a white blouse or shirt, house tie and only a green or black branded school jumper.

**Shoes** - students should wear formal shoes, no trainers or trainer style shoes or any footwear with a sports brand, apart from PE/Games lessons.

**Jewellery** - No facial piercings and only one stud earring in each ear, no bracelets or ankle bracelets and any necklace with a cross or other symbol of religious significance should be tucked away and removed during PE lessons.

**Hair** - hair colour should be a colour which is naturally occurring and not two-tone in nature. Students should not have their head shaved, number 2 on clippers is acceptable.
